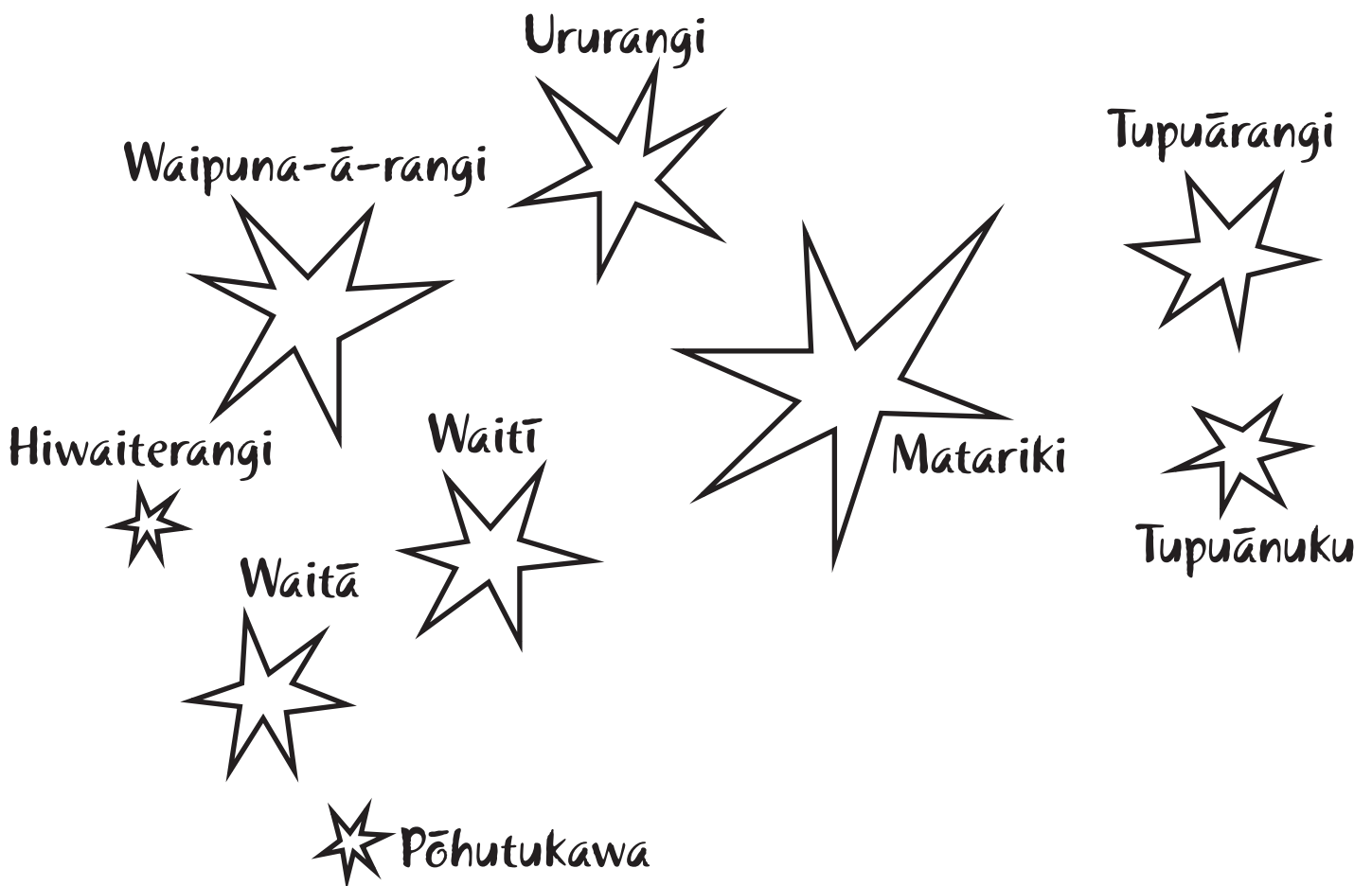


The 9 stars of Matariki

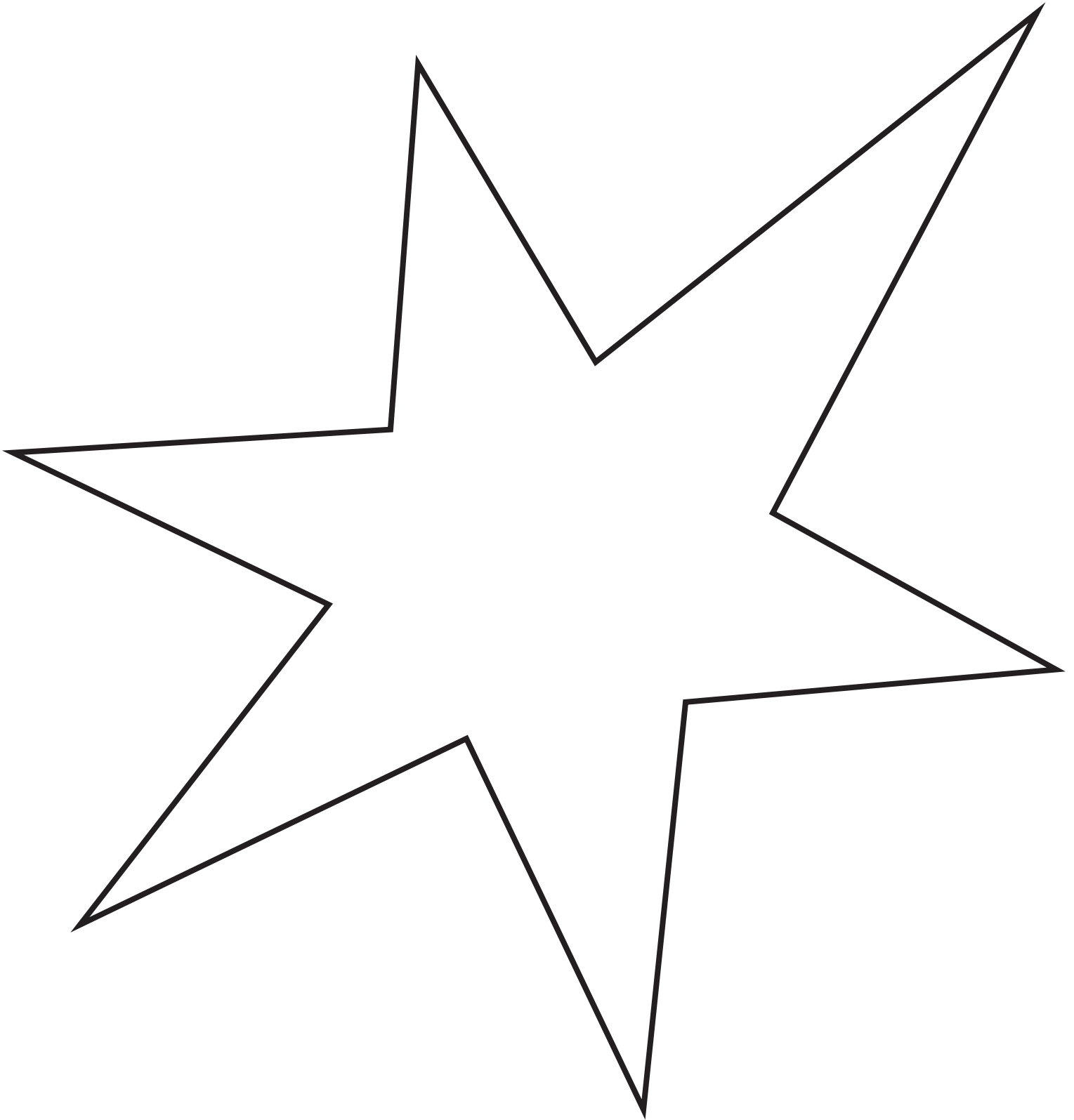

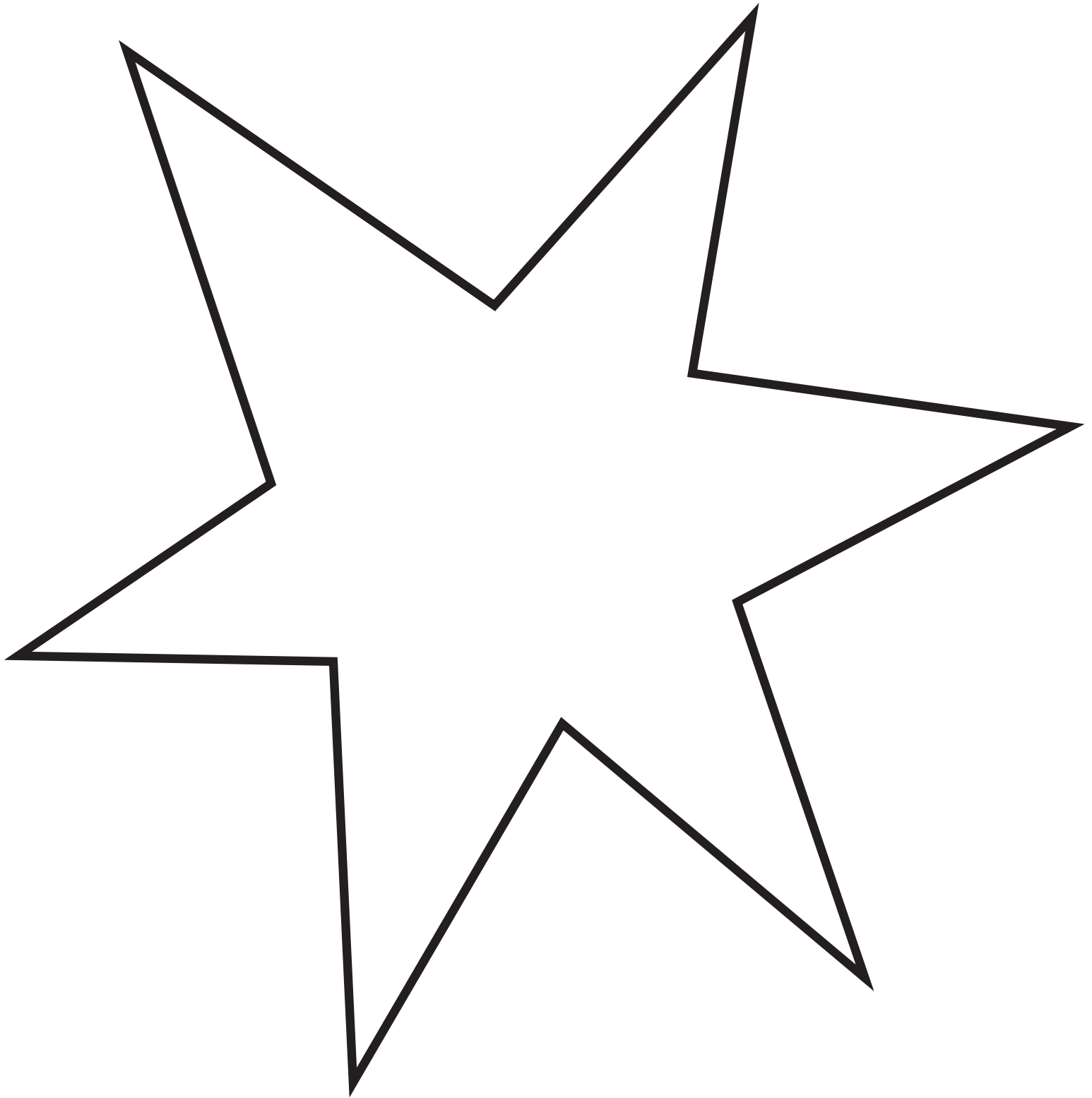

Matariki



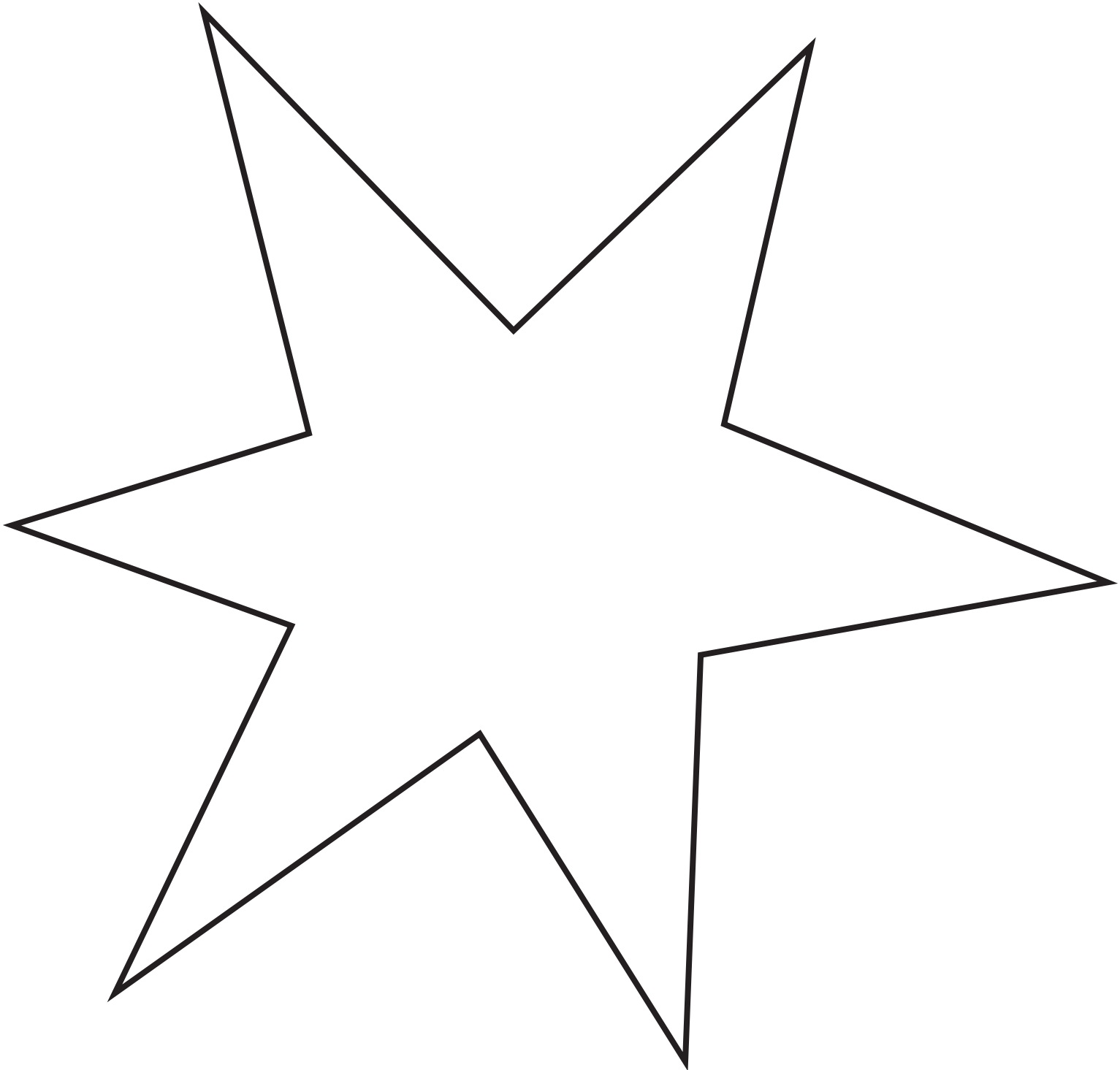
Matariki is the star that means reflection, hope, our connection to the environment and the gathering of people. Draw pictures inside this star which reflect this meaning.

Pōhutukawa



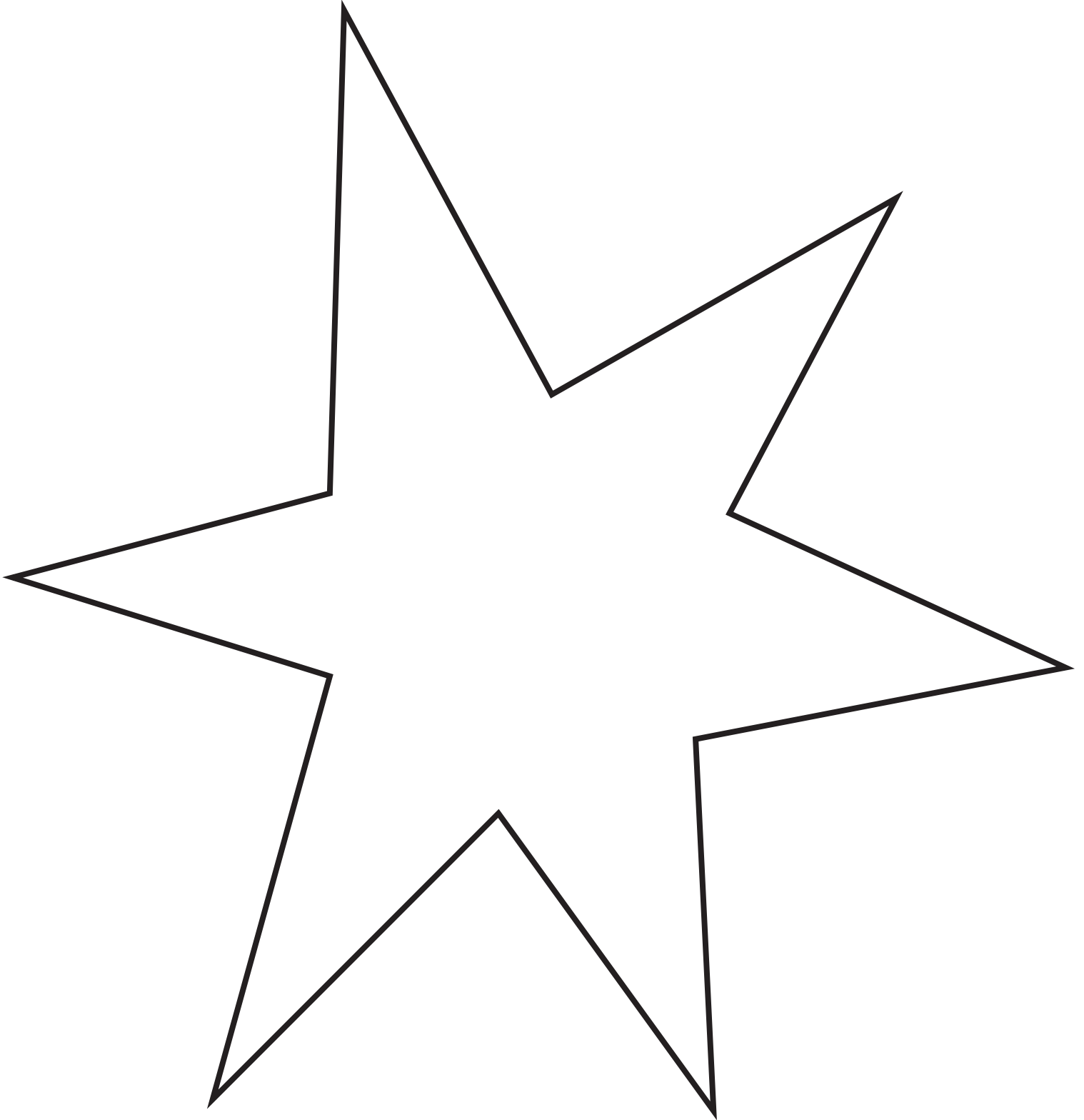
Pōhutukawa is the star that represents our loved ones passed on.

Waitī



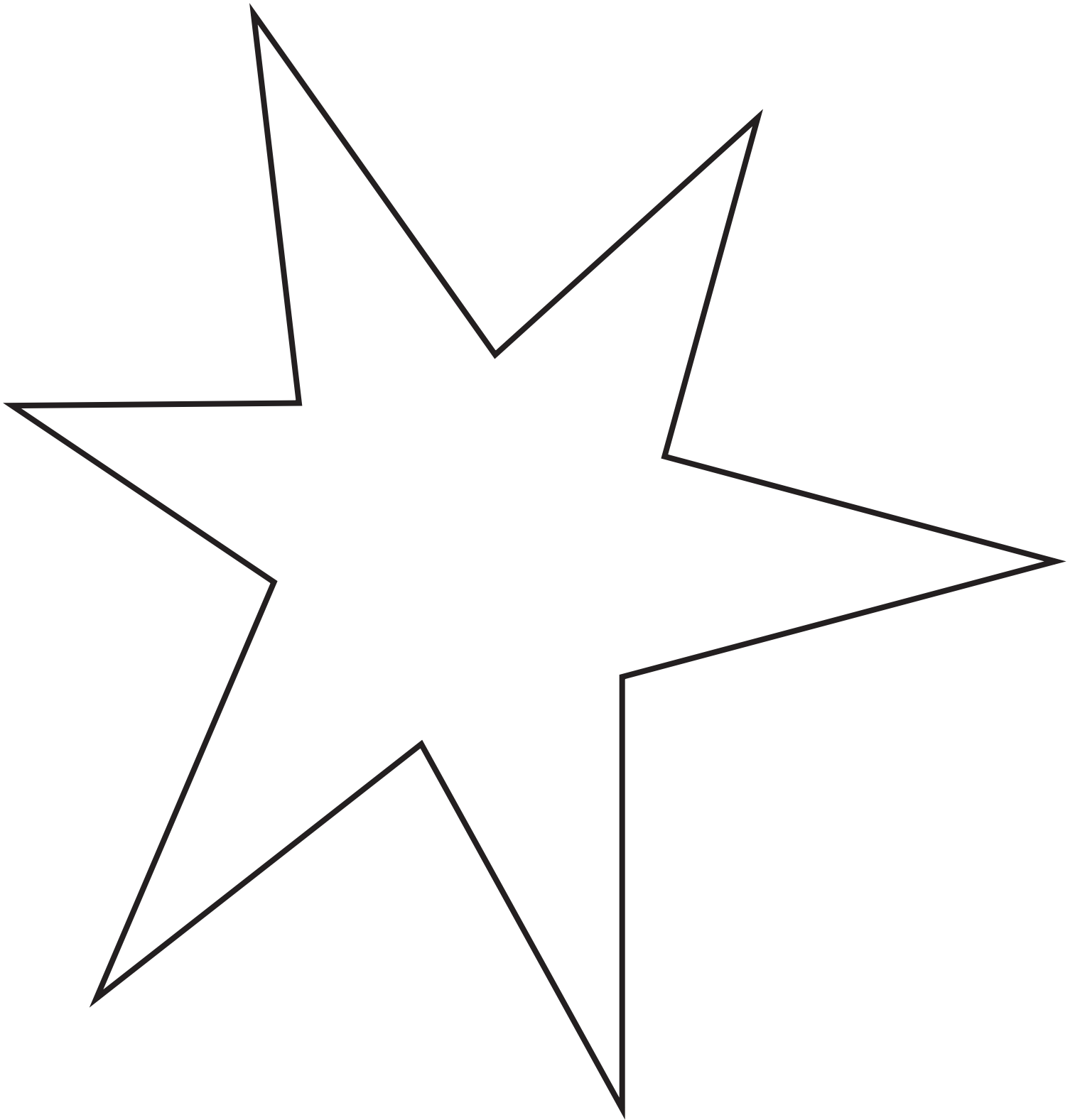
Waitī is the star that represents all fresh water (Lakes, Rivers) and food sources that come from them. Draw pictures inside this star which reflect this meaning.

Waitā



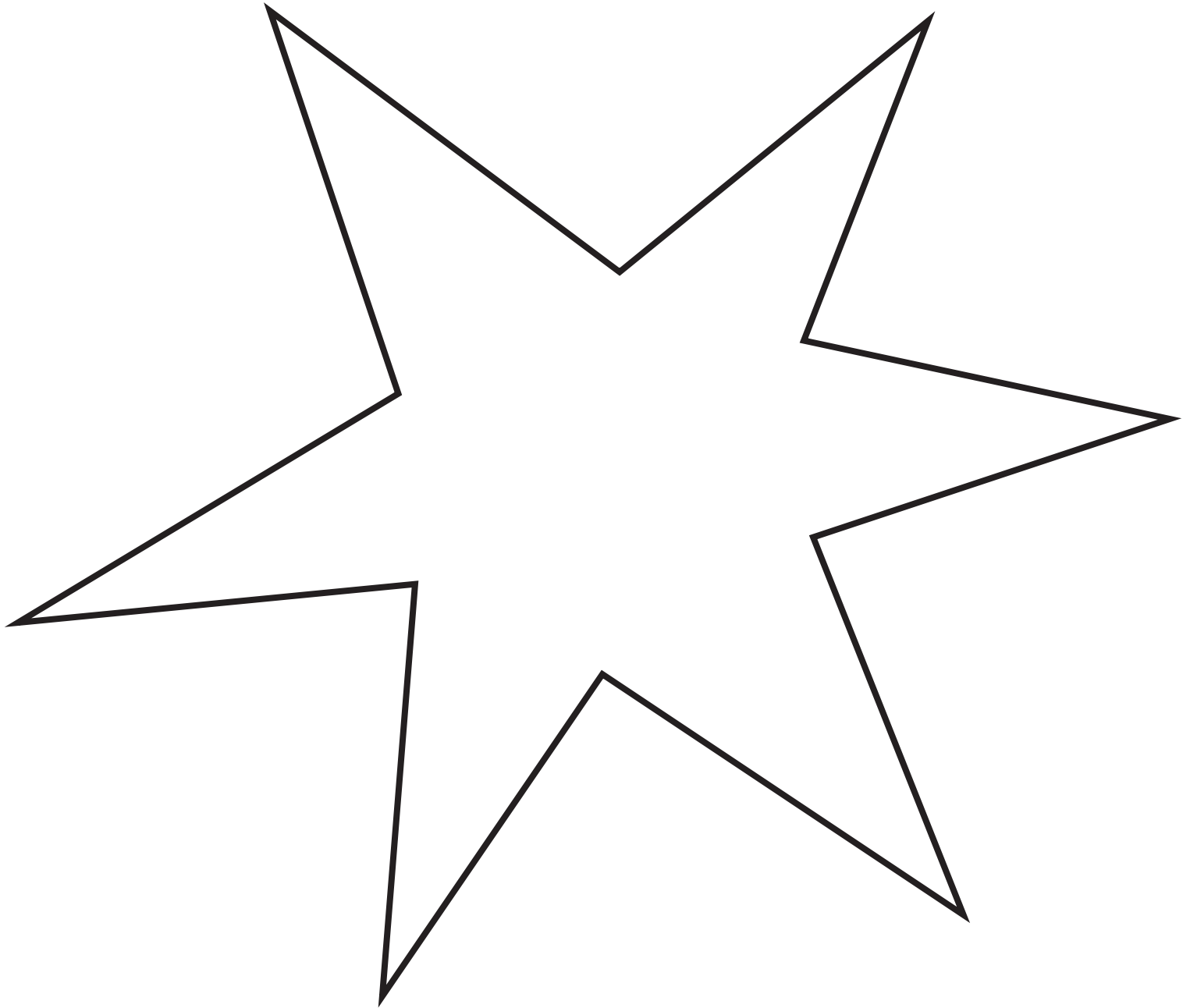
Waitā is the star that represents the ocean, and food sources within it.

Waipuna-ā-rangi



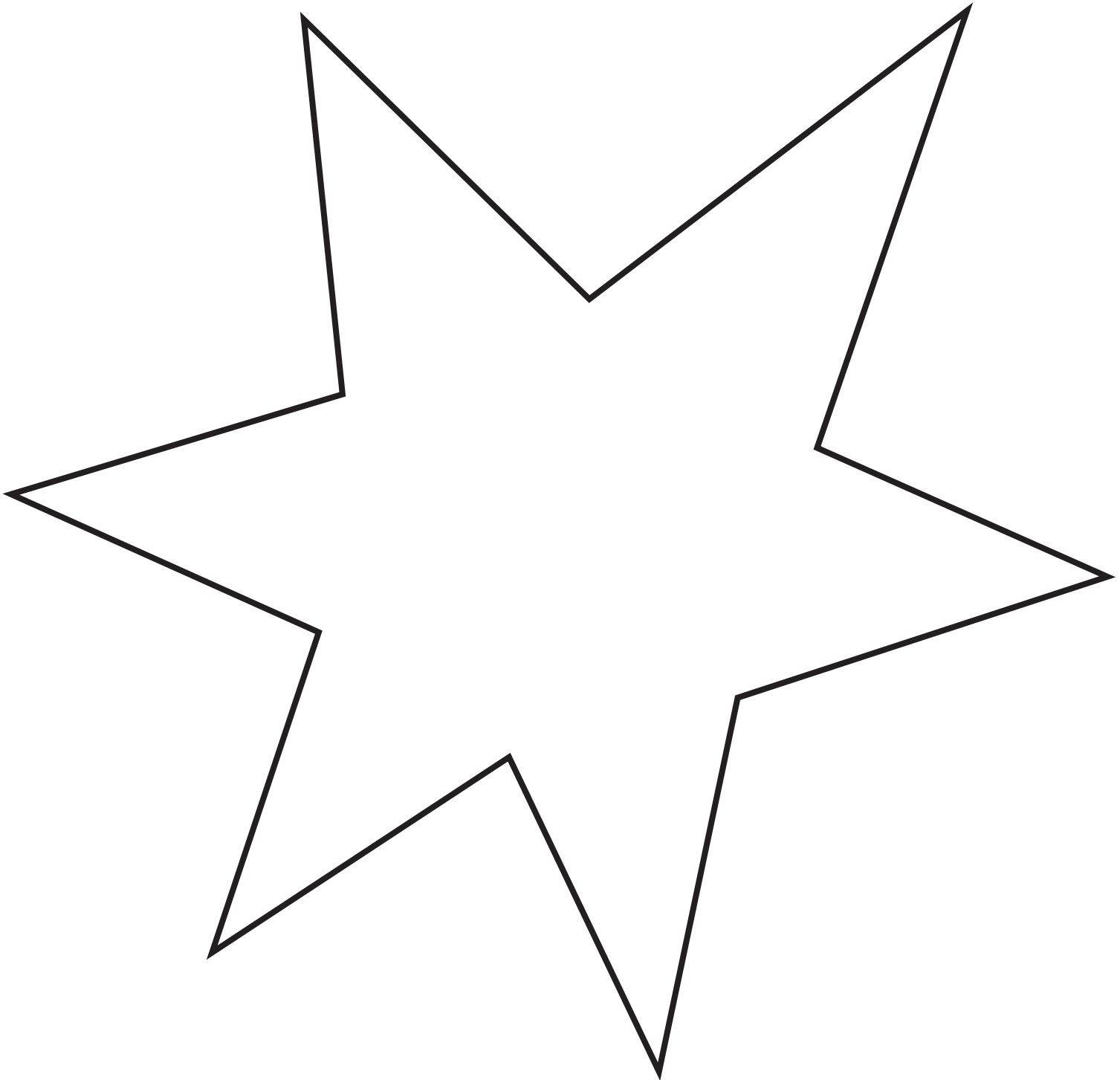
Waipuna-ā-rangi is the star that represents rain.

Tupuānuku



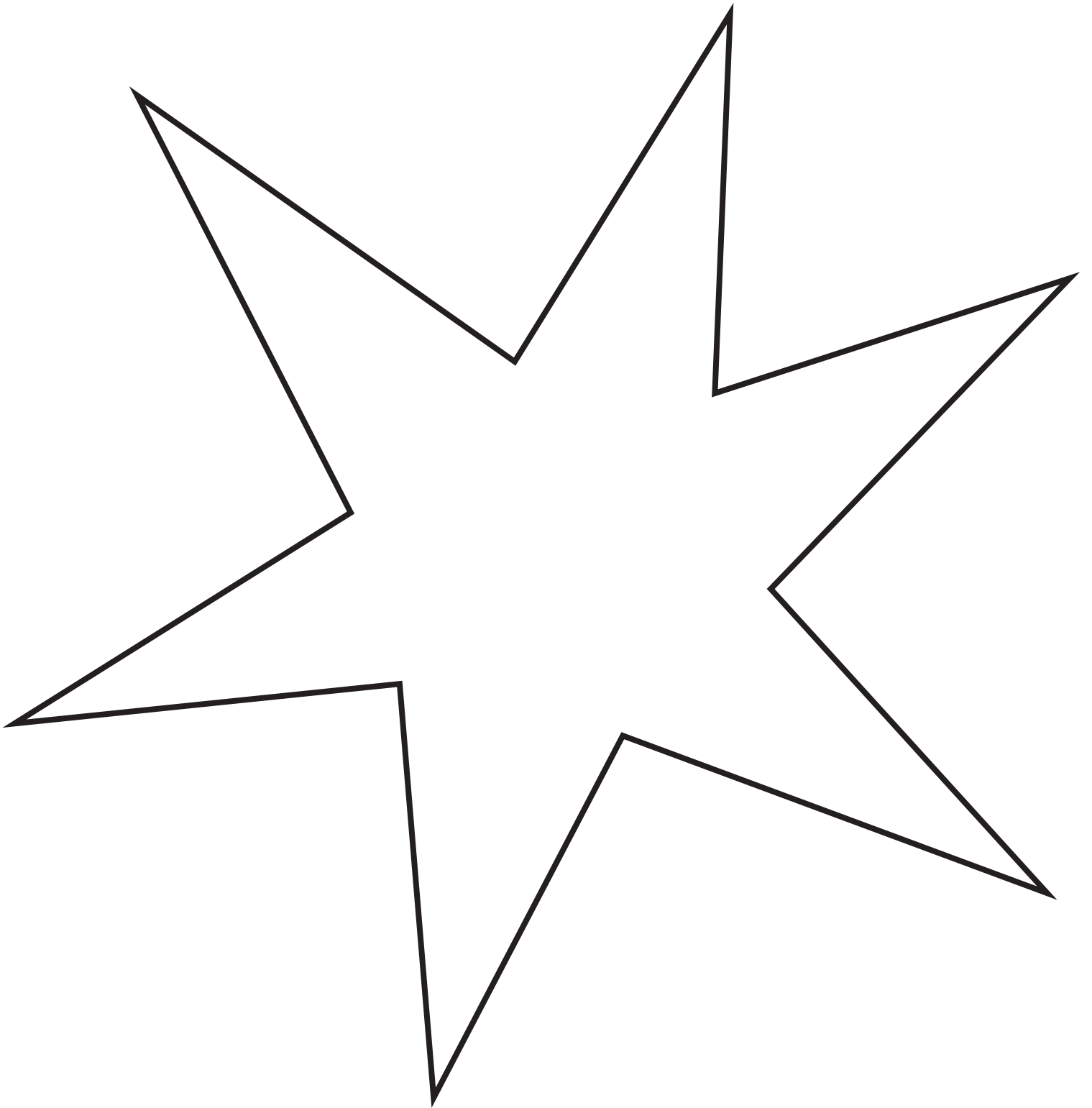
Tupuānuku is the star that represents everything that grows within the soil for food.

Tupuārangi



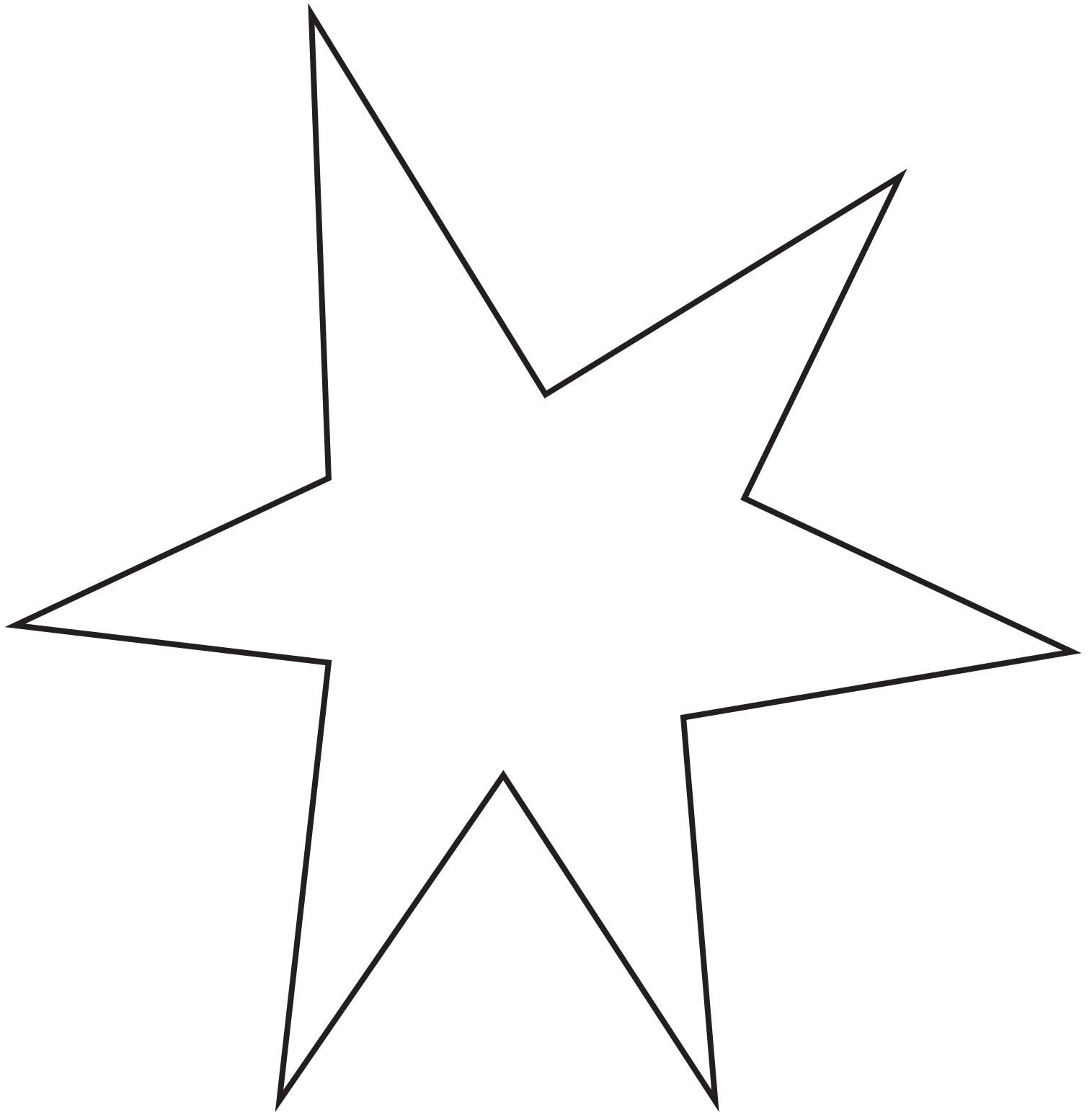
Tupuārangi is the star that represents everything that grows or lives in trees: fruits, berries, and birds. Draw pictures inside this star which reflect this meaning.
